2019 Beercan Series NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The competition will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the Prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association and applicable Class Rules unless any of these rules are changed by the Sailing Instructions.

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 A boat and her crew shall comply with ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The competition is open to boats of any class provided they are crewed by two or more persons at least one of whom be a full member of the SCSC.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the registration form available on the Saint Croix Sailing Club (SCSC) website and sending it, together with the required fee, to the SCSC Treasurer by 2400 hours on Wednesday, May 1st.
- 3.3 Late entries will be accepted.

4 FEES

There is no entry fee.

5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Skippers Meeting:
Thursday, May 16th at 1830 hours.
- 5.2 Dates of Racing:
Races will be held from Friday, May 24nd through Friday, September 6th and on Saturday, September 14th according to the calendar of races posted on the SCSC website. The scheduled time of the warning signal for each day is 1830 hours, with the exception of the Saturday race, when the warning will be at 1100 hours.
- 5.3 Awards Ceremony:
The date and location of the awards ceremony will be posted on the SCSC website by November 1st.
- 5.5 Number of Races:
The series shall consist of a minimum of one race and a maximum of 9 races. Abandoned races will not be rescheduled.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available on the SCSC website no later than 1830 hours on Thursday, May 16th. Additional copies of the Sailing Instructions will be available at the Skippers Meeting.

7 VENUE

The sailing areas will be the Saint Croix River between the Interstate 94 Bridge at Hudson, WI and Afton, MN and between the Hudson railroad bridge and the Stillwater Bridge.

8 THE COURSES

Diagrams showing the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left are available on the SCSC website.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 All provisions of RRS Appendix V shall apply.

10 SCORING

10.1 Races shall be scored using the high point system with boats being scored points one more than the number of boats that started the race minus the competitors finishing place. The series shall be scored by adding the number of points awarded in each completed race with no scores being excluded.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

12 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the top three finishers in each division for each completed race as well as the entire series.

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

14 INSURANCE

All boats shall carry adequate liability insurance and provide proof of insurance upon request by the Race Committee.
